## Farewell to the I-400! Hello to New Student Services construction!

This Friday, February 26<sup>th</sup>, marks the first day of demolition of the I-400 building. **Fencing will go up in Parking Lot #1 on Friday morning.** (See diagram on second page) This fencing (shown in **red**) protects pedestrians and cars from demolition activities, and provides a safe path of travel from the I-300 stairs and elevators to the Modular Village. The **green** line denotes the path of travel. New Faculty/Staff parking is shown in **orange**. New accessible spaces and path of travel are designated in **blue**. Please be aware that **parking spaces will be reduced in Lot #1 starting Friday**. Construction of the new Student Services Building is targeted for completion in May 2012.
